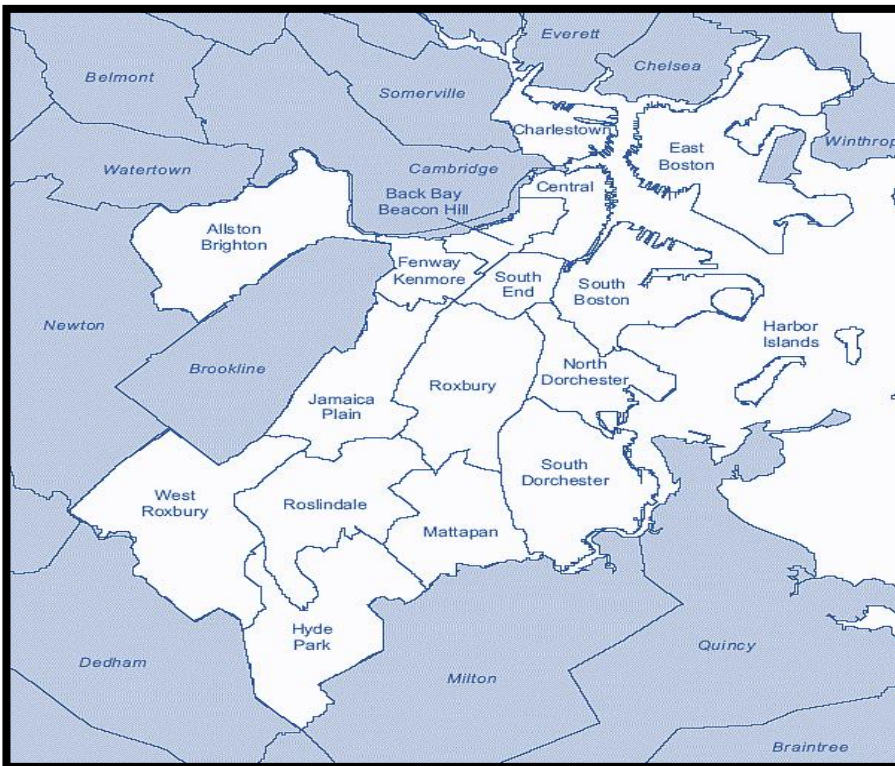

Tips for Navigating the MBTA:

Rush Hour is 7am-9:30am and 4pm-7pm. Trains arrive more frequently during Rush Hour.

The Commuter Rail extends beyond this map. Check out the MBTA website for Commuter Rail maps and schedules.

Download an app to see wait times for trains (ProximiT, MBTA Live, etc.).

Sign up on the MBTA website to receive alerts about train delays and service changes.

1. Check out the **Boston Common** and the **Boston Public Garden**: Enjoy the beautiful parks that are available right next to Emerson's campus

Depending on your office location, this is only a 5 minute walk away!



2. Visit the **Boston Public Library**: The Boston Public Library is one of the largest libraries in the United States, second only to the Library of Congress



3. Explore the **New England Aquarium**: The main ocean tank holds over 200,000 gallons of water and is home to over 1,000 different sea creatures



4. Tour the **Museum of Fine Art**: The museum is one of the most comprehensive art museums in the world, with over 500,000 works of art on display

5. Catch a show at any one of our **theatres**: Boston is home to many theatres that feature all kinds of performances
